



The Rector is away on sabbatical. During his absence, Canon Rex Davis is holding the fort. Here he writes about the Lent Discussions being held jointly with St John's, Hyde Park at the Grosvenor Chapel at 7.00pm on Wednesdays during the penitential season. Details of the remaining Discussions follow Canon Davis's remarks.

Jo Bailey Wells brilliantly launched the Lent course in the cosy Garden Rooms at the Grosvenor Chapel on Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> February. The team from St John's Hyde Park had provided hot soup and an array of cheeses and fruits for a Lenten supper before the meeting began.

Asking us to imagine being a grumpy and disconsolate bunch of wandering Israelites, still dripping wet from crossing the Red Sea, we were led, metaphorically, to the foot hills of Mount Sinai to gaze at the thunder filled black clouds as Moses went for his interview with the Lord to get a grip on the Law. Dr Wells showed herself a stimulating teacher as she unfolded the background to the narrative and the text of the Mosaic Law, from blessings to Abraham to the ambiguous "If" of the Covenant. Each question asked by a rapt audience led to even more fascinating thoughts. And in the discussion we began to unpack some of the layers of problems hidden in

the jam-packed story of the Exodus.

A fine start to the Lenten programme "A New Commandment". The next step takes us from the theological underpinning of the Law, an exploration in which both Luther and Calvin were slapped on the wrist for misunderstanding both Moses and Paul, a real double jeopardy, and very much a NO NO!! for Jo Bailey Wells, to some of the practicalities in our lives. For on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> February Dr Jim Walters, Chaplain at the LSE well bed us down in 'tax avoidance and banker bashing'. The series ends with Bishop Robert Hardy on "Imprisoned by Sin" on 20<sup>th</sup> March.

Last year the course focussed on the Christian's responsible use of money, and again an interesting list of panelists spoke of a number of issues. Roddy Leece, the Rector, Dr Brutus Green and Dr Richard Fermer have put their heads together to arrange this year's speakers, and it promises to be a stimulating session judged from its start with Jo Bailey Wells.

Despite the bitter weather there was a fair turnout. But, sadly, it struck me that St George's was poorly represented. It may be a good Lenten discipline to join the 5.45 pm congregation at the Eucharist and then take the brisk walk by Grosvenor Square to the Chapel, to be rewarded with a piping hot bowl of soup, followed by the challenge of a sharp talk and interesting discussion. All is over by 9 pm. Not too late.

## MISSIONARY MUSINGS by the Revd Dr Richard M. Fermer Priest-in-charge, Grosvenor Chapel

t is not an easy time to be part of an institutional church today. We all face our challenges, and although bricks and mortar, or how to pay for maiestic organs, may loom large, they are not all from that source alone. It is a reality for both churches in this parish, St George's and the Chapel, that more people now come to our buildings for a wedding, a memorial service or a concert than for regular Sunday worship. We are faced with the fragmentation and frenzy of modern life, the rise of secularism/ consumerism and the decline of institutional religion. It leaves us with a quite large gap or disconnect, between the committed church life of the core and what we can expect from those occasionally entering our churches. Over a third of the UK population no longer has any significant experience of the church: it is no longer an explicit part of their cultural baggage, despite the history. That means we cannot assume that people will just come to us or even if they do, that they will have any idea about what they are coming to or what is going on. So we find ourselves in this rather strange, uncomfortable space, a space that our churches have never before faced.

Some sociologists refer to this phenomenon as "Post-Christendom". Since Constantine, Christianity grew to hold a central place in western society, exercising, as it did, considerable power. Now it is increasingly gravitating to the margins, a place from which it emerged in the Early Church. The rector of St George's, for example, can no longer expect to be granted an audience with leaders of local business, when just forty years ago this would have been taken for granted. By the way, the thesis does not constitute a challenge to

the place of Christianity in the shaping of our culture and institutions in history.

The problem, however, is not just a changing world, it is also lies with our own perspective as church members. The missiologist and practitioner Alan Hirsch writes: "It is high time for us to dethrone Constantine; as far as matters of church go, it seems he is *still* the emperor of our imaginations." What Hirsch is trying to say is that although we may live in a "post-Christendom" land, our own thinking, as Christians is still decisively shaped by that paradigm. It is still the goal of most of our efforts. As Hirsch describes it:


"In the Christendom era the church perceived itself as central to society and hence operated in the *attractional* mode. In this, people *come to church* to hear the gospel, to be taught in the faith, and to partake of the sacraments." The problem is they are no longer coming, or more fairly, fewer and fewer are coming, despite the upbeat statistics of the Diocese of London.

A common error of Christians from institutional churches is to assume that mission is merely something unruly evangelicals do or is just another function or activity of the Church, coming somewhere on the bottom of our list. This manifests theological ignorance. Mission is first of all God's mission and is related to His very nature. Missio, which in Latin refers to "sending", has to do not merely with the sending of the Son and the Spirit by the Father, but also to God's inner being, that in Himself God is a communion bound in love. God's dynamic inner life flows out into creation and the redemption of the world. We, then, participate in God's mission, which is essentially the same thing as saying that we participate in His life. We have managed to get things back to front. Mission is not an instrument of the Church, rather the mission,



God's mission has a church, has an agent and this is our calling. Mission then becomes, alongside worship and prayer, something which is essential to the nature of what it is to be a follower of Christ.

In conclusion, both a proper understanding of the nature of mission and a facing up to our own social context and challenges should lead us to reflect more deeply on God's mission as it relates to the calling of our two churches here in Mayfair. A response to the challenges that face us would seem to come from an intensification of the Christian life and not its dumbing down. If we are ever to address the challenges, we need to be more authentically Christian, ever more people of the Bible, of deep prayer, of knowledge of the tradition, of social engagement, and not less so. At the same time, we need to become more flexible, to imagine Christian life outside the confines of what we have *learnt* to expect from our habitual Sunday service and pattern. We need to be prepared to step outside and plant the Christian message, which we are to embody in our lives, in unexpected places and to make the connections between those places - the workplace, the school, social groups and organisations - with our church. I look forward to working alongside you to help articulate our mission to Mayfair.


