The Rector writes . . .

St George's whilst I was away and we are immensely grateful for his care and support, and I would like to record my enormous thanks to him.

There were 3 objectives agreed with the Diocesan authorities for my 3 month Study leave:

To make the 8 day individually guided silent Ignatian retreat led by the Jesuits;

To study latest Biblical Scholarship (latest New Testament textbooks and articles in particular) ;

To compose a Missa Brevis (Latin setting).

All these aims were accomplished over 12 weeks full of many joys and a time of renewal and refreshment. 10 days at St Beuno's Retreat House in the snow of north Wales in January not far from Denbigh on Offa's Dyke, followed by 3 weeks of study and composing in a Spanish Presbytery. The decision to study St Paul in detail, rather than latest Biblical Scholarship in general paid dividends. Latest ideas and developments and approaches to the Bible were picked up along the way as I concentrated on

the particular (St Paul), as well as all sorts of new things about the Pauline corpus, which was rather thin in my degree syllabus.

Study and composing were continued at New Norcia in the Western Australian bush north of Perth in a Benedictine Community founded by Spanish monks in the 1850s as the guest of Abbot John Herbert OSB. New Norcia is Australia's only monastic town and has a unique heritage well known and valued amongst Christians of all denominations in the region.

Thence on to the University of Melbourne's Dalton McCaughey library for 10 days during which I worshipped one Sunday at Christ Church, South Yarra, where Kirsty Ross's husband will serve his title as a Curate. Then a week's holiday enjoying the Great Ocean Drive to the 12 Apostles, ending with the weekend in Brisbane for Palm Sunday. Holy Week and Easter were spent in Sydney, although I needed to leave Australia a few days earlier than planned in order to fit with school dates for my 10 and 12 year old Japanese nieces who live not far from Fukuoka on Kyushu island - the southernmost. I flew home via South Korea at the height of tensions

She has been a wonderful addition to our community.

Study leave/Sabbatical

I know there is huge appreciation for the way Canon Rex Davis looked after

and threats from the North, where I spent 5 days with my four Korean nieces - all in their 20s and doing well. Perhaps the best way to describe the memorable moments are by quoting what I wrote at the time:

St Beuno's Jesuit Spirituality Centre (extract from a letter)

Deep snow, silence, prayer, and a time of great blessing and living the scriptures. With a wonderful guide called Fr Brian McClorry SJ. I was in the attic up several flights of stairs. No reading (except some gospel passages) or music etc. but 8/9 days of total retreat and daily walks (encouraged) was bliss and I'm very thankful for the opportunity. The place is well organised and other groups on different programmes/retreats/courses etc. came and went (except those there for 3 months or 30 days!) with ease. Quite a triumph for everything to be well organised in this fabulous place that is a little like a spiritual Clapham junction! All was warm and cosy, the food was good, and the other 15 or so retreatants (of our group) seemed to be a nice lot. We only found out who we all were this morning - and it seems I was far from the only Anglican. The Bishop of Oxford was in our group, and Archbishop Thabo of Cape Town arrived a few days ago for 30 days - there were other priests and protestant ministers and crofters and people from Ireland and Holland, and all in all these last days have been a glorious start to my Study leave.

The Monastery at New Norcia (extract from a letter)

G'day from the Western Australian bush and the beautiful site of Benedictine New Norcia on this their Foundation Day (167 years ago) and when, at Mass, solemn profession was renewed by the 8 monks. And, for the few of us who eat in the refectory in silence with the monks, a Kit Kat was on the table at lunchtime today as a treat!

Well...there IS internet though no wifi. Unexpected. As is the aircon in my room, and fans etc. As is wine at every meal (I wondered about Lent!). As is the washing machine which means all my clothes were washed and dried by noon today. There is a good library for the guests, plus another near their old orphanage (they also have 2 empty schools (boys and girls) and a lovely 25 metre swimming pool).

But I am allowed into the enclosure and to use the monastic library which

is good. A great stock of books on St Paul and enough to keep me going in terms of interesting articles in periodicals etc. Also I have access to the oldest (and most Spanish, although everything looks Spanish and Baroque including the small Abbey church) and most beautifully decorated room in which resides a grand piano from Munich about 100 years old. It is the heart of the original monastery and full of good murals representing the sciences and arts and theology, and as agreeable a setting in which to compose as any you might find in Rome.

I've never seen such wonderful spacious open countryside with glorious sunrises, sunsets, full moons, galaxies of stars, red and brown earth, as many varieties and shades and shapes of Eucalyptus and other trees as you can imagine. Plus insects. Huge ants, goannas, hornets with their huge undercarriage, though I haven't really been bothered by them. Birds are amazing - the pink and greys (parrot/birds) look exotic to me but are as common as blackbirds here, singing like a class of naughty schoolchildren and are rather irritating. Up to 30 will cluster in a tree...and then there are green and yellow parrot/birds rather sleeker...and also white things that look like seagulls, Aussie Magpies too...a whole variety of different feathered friends.

You can check the New Norcia website and you'll see the whole place is owned by the monks. There is a hotel which cooks for itself, plus the guesthouse and the refectory so the food is fairly decent. The Abbey Ale is as good as any Belgian beer I've had, if not the best ever. Perfect after swimming 40 or 50 lengths in the nearby pool.

My timetable works well: 0500 Rise; 0515 Matins; 0645 Lauds; 0730 Mass Breakfast; 0900 - Noon Study and Composing; Noon Midday Office; 1215 Lunch; 1400 Swim at least 1km; 1600 - 1830 Study and Composing; 1830 Vespers; 1900 Dinner; 1930 Private Prayers; 2015 Compline.

The buildings are on either side of the Northern Highway and every 5 minutes or so in each direction huge trucks shake the whole area...about twice the length of what is permitted in the UK. Imagine a long articulated lorry and then a trailer attached which is equally long. Carrying heavy and enormous equipment for mining which takes place in the north (maybe 1000+ miles north?). But

mostly the road is very quiet and empty. In fact the main road has been closed for 3 days because a fire is still raging between us and Perth and traffic has to make a huge detour inland to avoid it.

Missa Brevis (New Norcia)

The setting of the Mass composed during my sabbatical/study leave will be sung for the first time on Sunday 20th October. The musical language has turned out to be much more 'friendly' than I imagined, and I think the Mass should be relatively straightforward for any good choir to sing. It is written for unaccompanied 4 part choir which divides into 8 voices on occasion.

The style or mood looks more to Iberia and the desert than to England's green and pleasant land given the context in which the Mass was written. The main Chapel at St Beuno's, which was at one stage a dark Victorian chapel for Jesuit priests in training has been transformed by hanging tent-like awnings from all corners of the building to the centre, thus suggesting a nomadic sense of regularly moving on, and of Middle Eastern deserts. Add to this my 3 weeks in Spain, and nearly a fortnight in an Australian Monastery built by Spanish Benedictines, it made sense to me to follow the logic suggested by history and environment.

Looking forward after this Study Leave

Having been a regular subscriber to various periodicals over the decades, and this being something I stopped (except for the odd gift subscription)

a few years ago, I have no plans to reinstate any periodicals. Not least because invariably there simply wasn't the time to read everything and justify the expense. A new issue would arrive whilst I would still be staring guiltily at the old one, and also with a change of editor often the whole style would change in an unwelcome way. However, it was a delight to have a whole range of the latest periodicals addressing a variety of theological and pastoral issues to hand in the various libraries in Australia, and it occurs to me that it would be so easy in London to book one afternoon a month to be spent in a library and keep abreast of the latest important articles. And this is on my 'to do' list, either using the library at Heythrop or King's College.

There are daily prayers in church, Monday - Friday at 12.10pm The Mid Day Office is said on most days, but with the Eucharist on Fridays and Saints Days. Please join us if you are in the area.

Requiem for departed loved ones will be celebrated on Friday 19th July at 12.10pm. Please inform the Verger if you wish to include the names of loved ones. Contact details are on the back page.

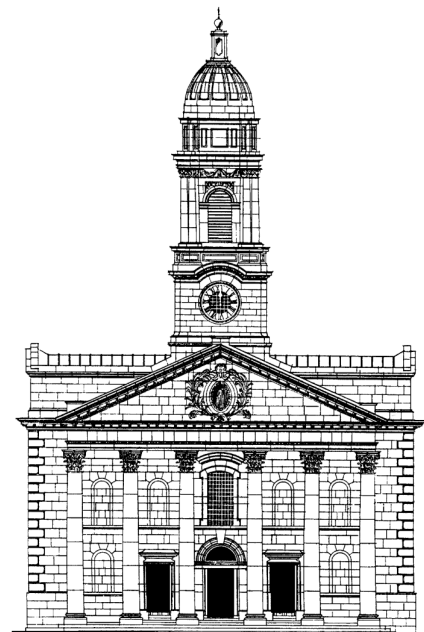
And finally . . .

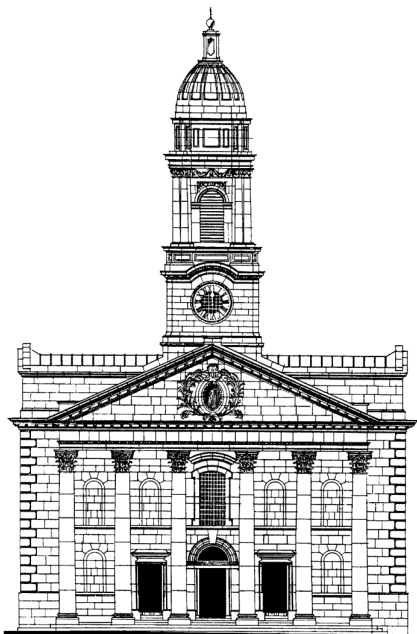

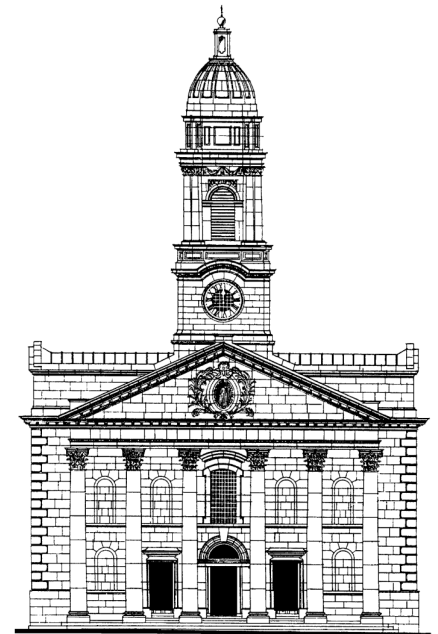

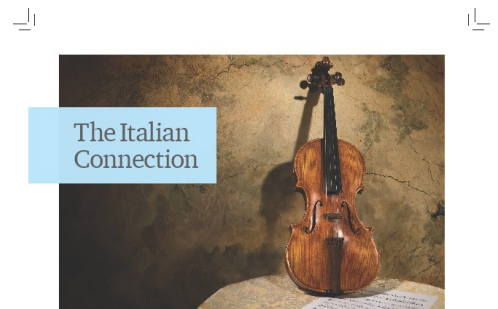

Let me begin at the end! On Sunday, August 4, 2013, the Transfiguration Choir from The Episcopal Church of the Transfiguration, Dallas, Texas, will sing for the 11.00 am Eucharist and offer a 3.30 pm Evensong at St George's Church. Our time with you will mark the conclusion of a fourteen-day musical pilgrimage through England. Before reaching London, the thirty-four musicians comprising the Tour Choir will have sung Evensong at Exeter and Bristol Cathedrals, three Sunday services at the church of St Mary Redcliffe in Bristol, and noonday recitals at Wells and Canterbury Cathedrals. The glorious histories and rich acoustics which these venues provide have long made them, for any chorister, the stuff of which dreams are made!

It will be St George's where we will feel most "at home." Your church and ours share a distinct honor: the magnificent Richards, Fowkes & Company *Opus 18* (2012) graces your west gallery, while its sister, the equally glorious *Opus 17* (2010) occupies and adorns our east gallery! Furthermore, the August 4th Evensong will be sung in honor of our feast of title - The Transfiguration of Our Lord. Thus, we will bring a portion of our own unique Transfiguration-Dallas tradition to the source of our Anglican tradition: a perfect conclusion to our pilgrimage.

The Transfiguration Choir

Over the course of the past year, the Transfiguration Choir has been busy preparing and raising funds to defray the cost of this tour. In November 2012, we presented "A Night in the West End," an evening of popular song from England and America, accompanied by silent auction, desserts and wine. Everything was conceived and executed by the Transfiguration Choir for the enjoyment of a packed house! Another fund-raiser, an April Gala of classical music accompanied by English High Tea, was another resounding success. Our latest choir recording, *Love Came Down at Christmas*, occasioned by countless requests from parishioners and clergy, was perhaps our greatest effort. The CD contains a number of familiar Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany carols in settings ranging from the Renaissance to the 21st Century, and includes compositions by our Director of Music, composer and organist Joel Martinson. It is because of these labours of love and the support of our parishioners that we will be able to join you in praising God through Eucharist and Evensong in August.

The Episcopal Church of the Transfiguration is a 1,900-member parish founded in 1956, whose mission is to seek and to serve Christ in all persons. We strive to present Jesus Christ as Savior through worship, education, evangelism, pastoral care and outreach. By our Anglican heritage and our community life, we endeavor to

be faithful in worship, dedicated to the study of scripture and to a life of prayer, open to the power of the Holy Spirit, and active in spreading Christ's love and reconciliation. The Ministry of Music at Church of the Transfiguration does not take this imperative lightly. Besides the year-round dedication of the 55 members of the Transfiguration Choir, our ministry includes two Children's Choirs, a Youth Choir, the Bella Musica (Handbell Choir), and a Men's Schola Cantorum. Our music series, *Transfigured Nights*, presents a number of evensongs, concerts, recitals and chamber music events each season as an outreach to the Dallas area.

And so I conclude at the beginning! Made confident by the support and love of our Transfiguration family, it is with great joy that we begin the pilgrimage which will ultimately lead us to St George's Church, Hanover Square. In the spirit of Anglican brotherhood and God's love, we look forward to meeting all of you on Sunday, August 4, 2013!

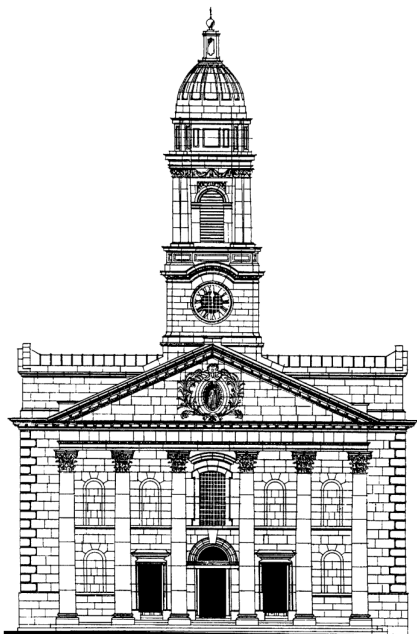

ROBIN WALKER



St George's Assistant Director of Music, Ronny Krippner left in April to take up the post of Organist and Director of Choral Music at Croydon Minster and Whitgift School. His place is being taken by Robin Walker whose first service will be on Sunday 28th July.

Robin started his musical training as a chorister at Ripon Cathedral before moving to Bradfield college as a music scholar. After a gap year spent as Organ scholar at Blackburn Cathedral he won a place to study organ at the Royal Academy of Music with David Titterington and Patrick Russell. There he won the organ prize and prizes for Choral conducting and church music, graduated with honours and was awarded the Diploma of the RAM.

Robin has held organist posts in London, notably at St Giles-in-the-Fields and the Tower of London, and has for the past few years been organist and choral director of La Badia Fiorentina, Florence's tenth-century Abbey, where he has played the 1558 Zefferini organ. He performs as organ soloists in Europe and North America, as conductor of Cantate Chamber Choir in Kent and as continuo player. He has made four solo recordings of organ music including "Byrd to Blow - the English Baroque Organ" recorded on the restored historic organ of St Giles-in-the-Fields, and two discs with American composer Frederick Frahm. Robin is married to Alison, a Minister in the Methodist church, who in September starts in a new post in Cambridge.

Belfast-born Bass-Baritone, tennis fanatic and technophile, Timothy Murphy started singing on the highest stave, but these days is always to be found on the lowest.

From Choral Scholar at Wells Cathe-

dral to Music graduate at Bristol University, Timothy moved to Ripon Cathedral as Bass Lay Clerk and since the autumn of 2010 has been providing a wide variety of musical services in London including as Gentleman of the Chapel Royal at Hampton Court Palace and the Tower of London, and also as a deputy at major churches such as Westminster Abbey, St. Paul's Cathedral, Royal Hospital Chelsea and the London Oratory.

In more public events Timothy performs solo, ensemble and operatic roles, many recorded, such as Stile Antico's *The Rose in Flower*, Platinum Consort's debut album *In the Dark*, *Missa Ad coenam Agni* & Eastertide motets with The Brabant Ensemble, and *Water Night*, the US and UK chart-topping album by the Eric Whitacre Singers.

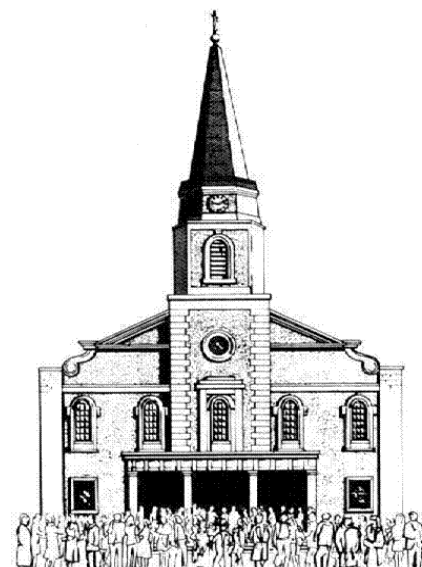
Much of last summer was spent rehearsing and performing in Birmingham Opera Company's production of Stockhausen's *Mittwoch aus Licht*, singing in Act II as part of Ex Cathedra in the critically acclaimed *Welt Parlament*. Timothy will be performing this part of the opera again with Ex Cathedra at the BBC Proms later this year.

Highlights in 2013 include an East Coast tour of America with the Eric Whitacre Singers, touring Ireland with The National Chamber Choir of Ireland, recording plainsong with harpist Siobhan Armstrong on her forthcoming album *Music in 16th Century Ireland*, and joining The Sixteen for their *Eternal Harmony* programme in Rotterdam.

In September 2013 Timothy will start a 2-year Vocal Performance Masters degree at the Royal Academy of Music.
